## Pesticides: Washing your Clothing

If you work with pesticides, you know that their danger extends beyond the fields. The clothing you wore to work can hurt you and your family. Here's what you can do if your clothing may contain pesticides.

Dry. Line dry if possible. Sunlight helps to break down chemicals. Also you will not get any pesticides in the dryer.

Clean out the washer to

be sure no pesticides are transferred to the next load of wash. Run a cycle with hot water and detergent but no clothing.



Hang clothing outdoors first to air.

**Rinse.** You can hose off the clothes, rinse them in a tub kept for that use, or use your washer's pre-rinse cycle.

**Wash.** Be sure to wash clothing that may have pesticides on it by itself. Use heavy duty detergent and HOT water. Hot water removes more pesticide than cold.

Rinse well.
